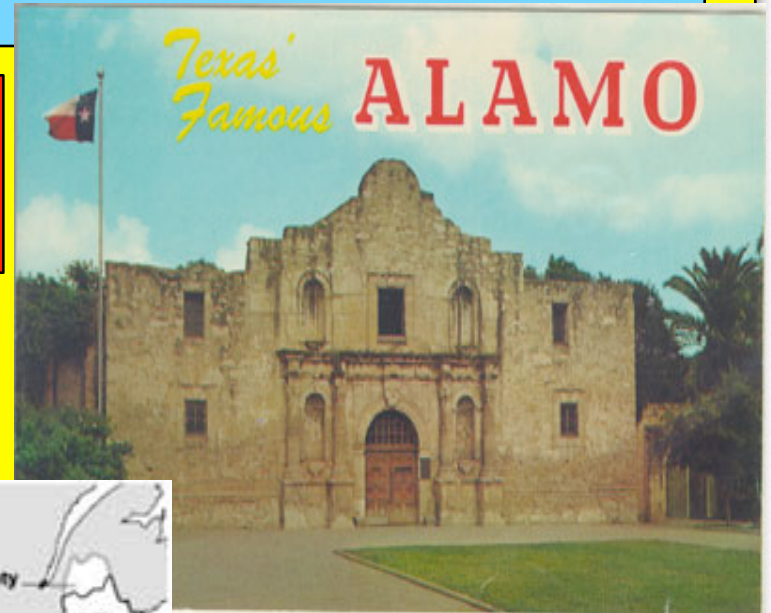


The student will demonstrate knowledge of the major events during the first half of the nineteenth century by a) identifying the economic, political, and geographic factors that led to territorial expansion and its impact on the American Indians (First Americans).

The American migration into Texas led to an armed revolt against Mexican rule and a famous battle at the Alamo, in which a band of Texan fought to the last man against a vastly superior force. The texans eventual victory over Mexican forces subsequently brought Texas into the Union.

THE ALAMO**



The American victory in the Mexican War during the 1840s led to the acquisition of an enormous territory that included the present-day states of California, Nevada, Utah, Arizona, and parts of Colorado and New Mexico.
